



Altona Primary School: **CHILD SAFE STANDARDS**

The safety of all students is of paramount importance at APS. It is our responsibility to ensure we are the advocates for children and do all that we can to make children feel safe and be safe from any form of child abuse. This responsibility extends to our whole school community, visitors, contractors and any other person or organisation who has contact with children.

The Victorian Government developed the *Child Safe Standards* in response to the recommendations of the *Betrayal of Trust report* that found more must be done to prevent and respond to child abuse in our community.

The *Betrayal of Trust* report recognised the strength of existing cultures, policies and procedures in place across Victorian government schools. The Child Safe Standards provide a framework to build on these strengths and identify areas for improvement to further strengthen policy and practices that keep children safe.

Our current practices and policies align to the 7 Child Safe Standards. The effective implementation of these standards entails a 'whole school approach'. All staff have undertaken professional learning to develop a clear understanding of the standards and their implementation.

Key messages:

- The safety and well-being of all children is a priority at Altona Primary School.
- We have zero tolerance of Child Abuse.
- We are committed to the cultural and linguistically diverse backgrounds of children; the cultural safety of Aboriginal children and providing a safe environment for all children including vulnerable children and children with disability.
- Policies and processes are in place to protect the care, safety and welfare of children.
- There are clear boundaries about how adults in our school community may interact with children.
- The Child Safe Standards apply to all school staff, school council, volunteers, contractors, visitors, external providers, parents and family members.

STANDARD 5 – Processes for responding to and reporting suspected child abuse

STANDARD 6 – Strategies to identify and reduce or remove the risk of abuse

STANDARD 7 – Strategies to promote the participation and empowerment of children
