# **Principal's Report**

On Friday last week we acknowledged World Teachers Day. Whilst this is not the only day we acknowledge the hard work of our staff, it did provide an opportunity for us to celebrate the team of amazing educators we are fortunate to have at APS. Their work is reflected in our positive outcomes, but more importantly, their commitment and dedication to our learners is what makes APS such a unique place to be. I feel privileged to work alongside such an experienced and passionate group of teachers.

#### MODERNISATION PROJECT

You may recall the announcement that our school has received \$1.2 million in funding to upgrade our fences and playground space. Over the last month Smith+Tracey Architects has been appointed to the project and they have commenced planning for the improvements. At this stage, along with replacing sections of our fence, the key areas of development will be the area outside Room 12-13 and the current spider playground space (see below map priority Area 1) and the area around the current Grade 3/4 classrooms (see map priority Area 2 and 3). A combination of

play spaces, gathering areas and passive play options are being explored. This is an exciting time for APS and I welcome any suggestions or input from interested members of our community. If you'd like to engage in discussion around this, please let me know.

#### **UNIFORM**
