2024 ANNUAL IMPLEMENTATION PLAN AND PRIORITIES

Our school's Annual Implementation Plan (AIP) outlines the improvement priorities for the coming year. Goals and targets are set based on those in the School Strategic Plan, along with measures of performance in student achievement data and survey results. This year, we will continue to focus on our key priorities of improving numeracy outcomes and improving student wellbeing. ARRIVAL AT SCHOOL

We have noticed that a large amount of children are arriving in the morning before the school yard is supervised. A reminder that our yard is not supervised until 8.45am and at this time, the supervision is of the synthetic courts in the middle of the school.

Any students arriving prior to 8.45am, should be supervised by a parent/carer, or alternatively attending the before care service. Our school oval, soccer pitch and playgrounds are off limits for any children who are arriving prior to 8.45am. Our central synthetic courts are supervised from 8.45-9am and should be the only place students are gathered or playing before school begins.

Our gates are currently being opened at 8.30am to support arrival at school for families. If your child is travelling to school without an adult, please reconsider the time they are leaving to coincide with an 8.45am arrival at school to ensure their safety and our duty of care.

NEW TOILET BLOCK

You may have noticed that our new toilet block was landed onsite over the break and after some initial 'hiccups' our Grade 5 and Grade 6 students are now able to use the facility. We are still waiting on some grounds works to be finalised around the space, but already we are seeing the benefits of our students having access to facilities in closer proximity to their classrooms. While these toilets have been allocated for our senior students, if our younger students are needing to access these with urgency in the breaks, they will be able to use them, with the same in place for the other toilet block.



FRIENDS AND FAMILIES COMMITTEE

Our FFC continues to be an active committee who work to plan and deliver experiences for our students and community. Along with this they support fundraising opportunities that enrich our school resources and grounds. Over the last two years, the work of the committee has seen the development of the Gaga Pit and replacement of the Spider playground, among other things. This year, there are plans to develop a new sandpit area, install beach style huts for play and street libraries across the school. The committee needs the support of parents and community members for it to continue and welcomes new members at any stage. You can be as actively or minimally involved as your schedule allows. The committee will have its first meeting of the year on Tuesday the 20th February at 9am in the staffroom for anyone who is interested in finding out what is planned for the year and how you might be able to support.
