Principal's Report

BEFORE AND AFTER SCHOOL

With the gradually improving weather, we are seeing an increasing amount of students arriving at school earlier. This is a reminder that our school grounds are not supervised until 8.45am. Students should not be arriving without an adult prior to this time.

With dismissal at 3.15pm, our yard is supervised until 3.30pm. At this time, our gates will be locked. We anticipate that families make their way out of our grounds by 3.30pm to enable our staff to attend after school meetings on time. Hindi, Japanese, Punjabi, Simplified Chinese, Somali, Turkish, and Vietnamese.
