
# Altona Primary School Newsletter

#### PARENT HELPERS

### COMMUNICATING WITH TEACHERS

Our teachers pride themselves on maintaining a positive partnership with parents/carers. Staff at APS can be contacted via email through Compass. Please be aware that these emails/messages cannot be attended to immediately. Beyond their classroom time, our staff have allocated duties and meetings through the day that may mean they are not able to attend to the email within the same day. Should you require information to be relayed with a greater urgency, please phone the office during school hours and our administration team will be able to support. Please also be aware that while some of our staff may choose to respond to an email outside of hours, there is no expectation for this to occur, so, respectfully, this should not be expected. We appreciate your understanding around this.

### **CLASS WhatsApp GROUPS**

A number of classes have WhatsApp groups that have been set up by parents as a way of connecting with parents/carers from your child's grade. These platforms provide a great opportunity to communicate with one another, however please be aware that these are not official forms of school communication. Parents/carers do not have to join the groups that are established, but they do provide a good platform to share information and establish connections across the school.

### **NAPLAN**

The National Assessment Program for Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) will be conducted from the 13th – 22nd of March. All students in Grade 3 and 5 will complete 4 separate assessments: Writing, Reading, Language Conventions and Numeracy. All tests will be completed online this year, except for the Grade 3 Writing test. Further information has been communicated through Compass to Grade 3 and 5 families and our schedule of assessments is below:
