Principal's Report

We are now at the end of week 7, with two weeks left of term and our first semester. Hard to believe we are almost halfway through the school year. At the end of this semester parents/carers will receive their child/ren's end of semester report. This report provides an indication of student's performance against the Victorian Curriculum standards. Teachers make judgements based on a number of assessments and observations which are conducted over the course of the semester. To support this, our staff also meet to participate in collaborative moderation of work samples to ensure judgements are balanced across the grades. Reports will be published on Friday the 23rd June, our last day of term. Next term we will have parent teacher interviews which will allow for discussion around the report and next steps in learning for all learners.

MOBILE PHONES AT SCHOOL

Recently we have seen an increase in the amount of mobile phones and smart watches that students are bringing or wearing to school. Phones and smart watches pose a constant distraction to students as notifications come through. Please do not contact your child through the day on their personal device. Should you wish to pass on a message, this should be done by calling the office.

The Victorian Government has enforced guidelines about the use of phones in school which aligns with our school policy. Students who bring a phone to school must store it in the lockable phone box in their classroom. Smart watches that are being worn, need to have the cellular function disabled while at school, or alternatively the watch can be stored in the lockable box. We appreciate your support with this.

WORKING WITH CHILDREN CHECK

Any parent/carer or community member that volunteers time in our school must have a valid Working with Children Check (WwCC). This includes volunteers attending excursions or incursions, supporting in the classroom or helping with a FFC event such as Canteen Day or Stalls. A WwCC can take weeks (sometimes months) to process after an application has been submitted. If you don't already have a WwCC, it is a worthwhile consideration to apply for one. Free for volunteers, having a WwCC enables you to have the option to support with any of the abovementioned events at short notice, and we are always thankful to have the support.

SHOWCASES OF LEARNING

In the coming weeks our termly Showcases of Learning will be held. Dates and times for these have been published on Compass and appear later in our newsletter. Our students are looking forward to sharing their learning with those that attend. We do recognise that some children may not have a parent/carer or other visitor who is able to attend. To support this, we ensure that all children present their work to the audience, with a focus on developing presentation and public speaking skills. Teachers and members of our leadership team are always in attendance to support those students who may not have a visitor.

SAFE TRAVEL TO SCHOOL

We continue to receive reports of children taking unsafe risks while travelling home, particularly on bikes. If your child does travel to and from school on a bike, I urge you to revisit their path of travel with them if they are riding to school without an adult. We have had a numerous reports from community members of students from our school travelling in the wrong direction on the roads on Railway Street South and North. If your child needs to travel along either Railway Street South or North and they are riding on the road, please have a discussion with them about the nature of a one way street and the importance of travelling in the same direction as vehicles.

Introducing Zones of Regulation at APS

Recently your children have begun learning about The Zones of Regulation in their classrooms.

The Zones of Regulation is a well known program used in many schools to assist in teaching students how to identify and regulate their emotions.

The Zones are broken into the following 4 categories:





















BLUE ZONE Sad Sick Tired Bored Moving Slowly






RED ZONE Mad/Angry Mean Terrified Yelling/Hitting Out of Control

Students are encouraged to acknowledge how they are feeling (all feelings are valid and important), identify which zone these feelings fall into and access regulation **tools** to support them if they are feeling dysregulated.

Teachers will work with students to develop regulation strategy tool kits in their classrooms. E.g., breathing exercises, movement breaks, quiet space, talking about it etc.

We are excited to work on **building student's emotional intelligence and self-regulation skills**. You may notice visuals around the school to support this.

We encourage you to chat to your children about the Zones. We hope this opens up an opportunity for common dialogue around feelings and self-regulation at school


